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Did You Know?

Signs are typically one of the lowest cost items in an educational facility, but they significantly impact the image and efficiency of the college or university. In our experience, getting them right means answering four key questions.



Can I see it?

Tip 1. Think about where you position signs and ensure clear sight lines. Use our colour contrast charts to check wall colours against signage.



Can I read it? Is it clear?

Tip 2. A prime constraint on the legibility of a sign is the viewer's distance from it. A simple mathematical relationship exists between the size of letters and the maximum distance from which a user can read them.



Can I understand it?

Tip 3. Keep it simple and use language which the user will understand. Zones and codes often work for the facility, but they must also be understood by those using and visiting the space.



Do I trust the information?

Tip 4. Professional, quality signage and graphics not only support the branding of the college or university but also give legitimacy to the signs, leaving visitors confident that they can trust the information given.
